Presentation: Lynn Youth Council

After the presentation, Councillor Crighton presented the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION

Resolved that the City of Lynn hereby establishes a Lynn Youth Council comprised of eighteen (18) members selected from male and female applicants aged twelve (12) to nineteen (19) who will make recommendations to the Lynn City Council and School Committee relative to youth issues in the City of Lynn. The Lynn Youth Council shall empower youth as a positive voice in the community; seek input from youth regarding city issues and civic concerns, promote youth with direct experience of governance processes and raise the image of youth in the city of Lynn. Members of the Lynn Youth Council shall attend regular monthly meetings, participate in training, orientation and other activities, conduct research, discuss issues facing Lynn youth, represent peers and meet and make recommendations to the City Council. Nine members of the Lynn Youth Council shall be appointed to serve for a term of one (1) year and nine members shall be appointed to serve a term of two (2) years. Members shall be selected by a committee composed of an official from the Lynn Public Schools, the YMCA and North Shore Community College.
